
Improving care for people in our communities who are dying or have conditions which will shorten their lives.

We have spent time listening to our staff. We have contacted our stakeholders and partners across the health and care system and third sector and asked how they think we should develop.

We also asked our supporters what they believe is most important for us for the next five years.







Our context and challenges

We are a long-established charity providing in-patient hospice services for adults in north Cumbria, and children and young people across the whole of the county.

We are based in Carlisle and opened our doors in 1991. This means while we have developed expertise in what we do, we know our building is old and has required significant updating. There is more to do to make sure it is fit for the future.

We know nationally there are challenges in a number of areas. While support for palliative care has been explicitly included in the 2022 Health and Social Care Act, there are challenges around funding and equity of services across the UK. We know too there are gaps in the clinical workforce now and in the pipeline. While we have worked hard to make Eden Valley Hospice and Jigsaw a good place to work with a focus on development and training, we anticipate those gaps will have an impact.





Our wider workforce is also under pressure, and we need to ensure people feel valued and supported while they work with us.

To ensure our services remain effective for our community we must make sure our funding is sustainable and that any income works hard for our charity.

The three north Cumbria hospices commit to closer working in line with our shared ambition of delivering excellent end-of-life care for our community and building on the strong collaborative work already underway.
